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Part-I Information, Eligibility Criteria & Rules for Players

1. Introduction

The CAU Player Eligibility Handbook has been designed to address key concerns regarding player eligibility for representing teams at the district, state, club, institution, and academy levels in Uttarakhand. Applicable to all matches and tournaments governed by CAU Player Eligibility rules, the handbook serves as a comprehensive guide for both men's and women's cricket. It outlines the essential eligibility criteria that players must understand before participating.

The handbook covers all domestic matches organized for Uttarakhand's men's and women's teams across multiple formats, including T20, One Day, and Multi-Day games.

2. Player Registration

For a team to participate in any CAU-sanctioned fixture or event, the respective governing body must submit a CAU Squad Registration Form. Separate registration forms are available for both men's and women's events to ensure proper documentation.

The team squads, including the number of players and reserves as specified by CAU, along with the required verification documents, must be submitted using the designated form no later than 10 days before the start of the tournament. However, in some cases, the event organizers may request this information earlier as well.

3. Player Verification

To register a player for an event, the relevant club, institution, academy, or district body must submit background information, demonstrating that the player meets the CAU Eligibility Criteria. The concerned CAU district is responsible for maintaining accurate records and documentation of the player's background for any necessary future reference.

Once a player is registered and his/her details are entered into





the CAU Player Eligibility Database, the supporting documentation does not need to be resubmitted for future events unless specifically requested by event organizers or CAU Management.

4. CAU Player Eligibility Rules & Procedures

The Players Eligibility Rules are designed to determine a cricketer's eligibility to register with CAU and to play for or represent a club, institution, academy, district body in any CAU-sanctioned tournaments, as well as to be considered for selection in any CAU team. Once the registration and verification process are completed, district body/ CAU enters all verified players into the CAU Player Eligibility Database. This process eliminates the need for districts to re-submit supporting documentation for players who qualify by birth in the state.

However, in the case of resident players or those applying under exceptional circumstances, the necessary information must be re-submitted and may be re-verified for each tournament. It is important to note that the ultimate responsibility for ensuring all players is eligible to participate in any event lies with the District Association.

District Association are required to maintain a database of their players. For consistency and ease of reference, it is requested that this database follows the same format as the CAU Squad Registration Form. District bodies are also responsible for checking and verifying all relevant documents for players within their jurisdiction, regardless of whether the player represents a club, institution, or academy affiliated with that district.

Note: The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI)/ CAU has specific eligibility criteria for local players across various age groups. These guidelines ensure fair participation and proper registration for domestic tournaments.

Boys : Under-14, Under-16, Under-19, Under-23 & Seniors





Girls : Under-15, Under-19, Under-23 & Seniors

***Note:** The BCCI Cricket Season commences on September 1st each year. Consequently, a player's age eligibility for various categories will be determined based on their age as of September 1st of that season.

A Cricketer shall be eligible to play for a member based of:

Bonafide individual by birth: A Cricketer within CAU Jurisdiction he/she is born.

OR

Bonafide individual by his/ her Educational Qualification/ Employment and Residence: A cricketer is to be eligible as a local player should be studying/ working/ residing in CAU Jurisdiction.

Note: Marksheets from Open School and Distance Learning programs will not be accepted under any circumstances. All certificates, except educational certificates, will be counted from September 1st for the completion of any year.

To support this, the player is required to submit self-attested copies of the relevant documents. These may include the self-attested copy of below mentioned documents as per his/ her eligibility criteria:

4.1 Local Player Bonafide individual by birth

To be recognized as a Local Player Bonafide Individual by Birth in Uttarakhand, an applicant must provide the following documents:

a) Birth Certificate

- ✓ A computerized birth certificate issued by the concerned government authority of Uttarakhand must have been issued at least three years prior to the date of registration. (Mandatory)

b) Residence Proof

- ✓ Aadhaar Card OR a valid voter ID Card OR a valid passport for residency proof in Uttarakhand.

***Note:** All above required document must have been issued at least one years prior to the date of registration. In the





case of an Aadhaar Card, its history must be available and verifiable.

c) **Educational Certificates (Mandatory)**

To establish proof of educational history in Uttarakhand for at least the past two years, students must provide marksheets of passed two years along with a current Bonafide certificate issued by their institution, if he/she is currently enrolled anywhere. Accepted documents may include:

- ✓ Marksheet of Primary Education
- ✓ 10th Marksheet (mandatory if the individual has qualified for this level of education).
- ✓ 12th Marksheet
- ✓ Graduation Marksheet

4.2 Local Player Bonafide individual by Educational Qualification

a) Current Academic Certificates (3 Years)

- ✓ Marksheets from Primary Classes, 10th, 12th, Graduation, or any other equivalent Degree/Diploma course from the last two years, along with the Bonafide Certificate for the current year issued by the educational institution in Uttarakhand.
- ✓ The Class 10th Certificate is mandatory if the individual has qualified for this level of education

b) A computerized birth certificate must have been issued at least 02 years prior to the date of registration.

c) Aadhaar Card OR A valid Voter ID Card OR A valid Passport for residency proof in Uttarakhand.

***Note:** All above required document must have been issued at least one years prior to the date of registration. In the case of an Aadhaar Card, its history must be available





and verifiable.

4.3 Local Player Bonafide individual by Employment & Residency

To establish employment verification and residency in Uttarakhand, the applicant must provide:

- a) Certificate from Employer
 - ✓ Employer's Appointment Letter must be issued by a Government Organization/ Public Sector Undertaking (PSU)/ Multinational Corporation (MNC) or Private Sector Firm, along with last 12 Month Salary Slip.
- b) Bank Statement (Last One Year)
 - ✓ A bank statement covering the past one year, showing regular (month on month) salary credits at the time of registration.
 - ✓ The salary must be deposited in the applicant's account by the same employer mentioned in the certificate.
- c) Other Supporting Documents
 - ✓ The player must provide proof of active representation in a club, institution, academy, or district affiliated with CAU for the past two years. This proof must be on the official letterhead of the concerned district Secretary or President.
- d) Aadhaar Card OR A valid Voter ID Card OR A valid Passport for residency proof in Uttarakhand.

***Note:** All above required document must have been issued at least one years prior to the date of registration. In the case of an Aadhaar Card, its history must be available and verifiable.

4.4 Exempted Players

4.4.1 Currently Registered CAU Players

Players who are already registered with the Cricket Association of Uttarakhand and are actively representing CAU in Board matches—whether at the





senior or age-group level, are exempted from the provisions outlined in Rules 4.1, 4.2 & 4.3.

***Note:** However, CAU management reserves the right to request the resubmission of relevant documents if deemed necessary at any time.

4.4.2 Men's Players with Prior CAU Representation

Men's players who previously represented CAU at any age level and later moved to another state for studies, work, or public service can regain eligibility for the CAU State team after the mandatory cooling-off period of one year.

However, they must meet the following conditions:

- ✓ Obtain a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from their previous association.
- ✓ And submit the NOC to the CAU office before Sep 15th AND during the cooling-off period the player must provide proof of active representation in a club, institution, academy, or district affiliated with CAU for the past one year. This proof must be on the official letterhead of the concerned district Secretary or President.

4.4.3 Women's Players with Prior CAU Representation

Women players who previously represented CAU at any age level and later moved to another state for studies, work, or public service can rejoin the CAU State team without a mandatory cooling-off period. This cooling-off period exemption will apply for the next five years.

However, they must meet the following conditions:

- ✓ Obtain a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from their previous association.
- ✓ And submit the NOC to the CAU office by September 30th.

***Note:** For any further clarification or procedural guidance, players are advised to refer to the official guidelines or consult the relevant CAU authorities.





CAU requires above self-attested documents from the player to further verify his/her eligibility as per the specific CAU Player Eligibility Rules. These self-attested documents are essential to ensure that the player fully complies with the eligibility criteria set by CAU. The submission of these documents serves as a formal declaration by the player and supports the authenticity of the information provided in the registration process.

If a player is found guilty of submitting fake or forged documents to participate, attempt selection, or play in a CAU tournament, they will be debarred from competing in any CAU Tournament for a minimum of two cricketing seasons.

5. Additional Rules and Regulations

5.1 Single Registration Rule

No player shall be registered with more than one club, institution, academy, or district within CAU jurisdiction. If a player is found to be registered with multiple entities, disciplinary action will be taken against the associated organization(s) if any involvement is detected. Additionally, Player will face two cricketing seasons ban from all domestic cricket matches under CAU.

5.2 Annual Registration

Every player intending to participate in league or tournament matches conducted by CAU must be registered annually. A player may choose to register through a private club, institution, academy, or district.

5.3 Change of Affiliation Body

A player wishing to change his/her affiliated club, institution, academy, or district within CAU jurisdiction for the upcoming season may do so within the official registration deadline. It is mandatory to complete all required procedures—such as obtaining a No





Objection Certificate (NOC) from the previous club, institution, academy, or district, and submitting it to the relevant CAU body before 15th Sept. Additionally, all necessary documentation and approvals from the respective District Association must be submitted within the stipulated time frame with a copy sent to CAU to ensure a smooth and valid transition.

***Note:** For further details on registration guidelines, deadlines, and required formalities, players should refer to official regulations or contact relevant CAU authorities.

5.4 Eligibility by Birth but Representing Another State

Players born in Uttarakhand (Qualifying by Birth), but currently representing another state in Board Matches and who have not previously represented the Cricket Association of Uttarakhand (CAU) in any capacity, However, there is No mandatory Cooling Off period for these players and he/ she will be eligible for selection in CAU teams only if they:

- ✓ Obtain a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from their current/previous state association, and
- ✓ And submit the NOC to CAU on or before 15th September.

5.5 Formalities for Players Participating Outside the CAU Team

Players registered with the Cricket Association of Uttarakhand (CAU) must obtain prior written permission from CAU management if they wish to participate in a renowned tournament as part of another team, provided the CAU State team is also competing or in the same event and he/she was not selected for the CAU team.

Important Rule:

- ✓ Players are not allowed to compete against the CAU team under any circumstances.
- ✓ If a player wishes to participate in an affiliated,





recognized, or state level approved tournament in another state where CAU State team is not competing, as part of another club, they must submit a written acknowledgment to the Secretary of CAU before the tournament begins.

5.6 Non-Recognized Tournament and Matches

Registered players are not permitted to play in unrecognized or unaffiliated matches/ tournaments. Any violation of this rule will lead to disciplinary action ban of any format of Cricket organized or affiliated by CAU for the time period of two cricketing seasons.

5.7 Disciplinary or Suspension

Players who are under suspension or disciplinary action by any CAU district body, another state association, CAU or BCCI shall not be allowed to play for any affiliated entity within CAU during the period of suspension.

5.8 UPL/WUPL Performers

If a player is a Bonafide resident of Uttarakhand by virtue of birth, residency, student status, or employment, but is not registered with any CAU-affiliated club, institution, academy, or district, and is selected through direct trials for UPL/WUPL and subsequently performs well in the tournament, the final decision regarding their eligibility for selection in the State Team will rest with the CAU Management, in consultation with the Selection Committee.

6. BCCI Rules for U-16 & U-19 age group categories

Here are some key modifications to the BCCI rules for U-16 and U-19 age group categories:

6.1 Under-16 Age Group: Only players between 14-16 years old are permitted to register.

6.2 Under-19 Age Group:

6.2.1 For players who clear the TW3 bone test at the U-16 level & his/her birth certificate is also registered within





two years after birth, they will be allowed to maximum of four years of participation in BCCI U-19 tournaments.

6.2.2 For players who clear the TW3 bone test at the U-16 level, if his/her birth certificate is registered more than two years after birth, they will be restricted to a maximum of three years of participation in BCCI U-19 tournaments.

6.2.3 For players who don't clear the TW3 bone test at the U-16 level & his/her birth certificate is also registered within two years after birth, they will be restricted to a maximum of three years of participation in BCCI U-19 tournaments.

6.2.4 For players who don't clear the TW3 bone test at the U-16 level & his/her birth certificate is also not registered within two years after birth, they will be restricted to a maximum of one years of participation in BCCI U-19 tournaments.

6.2.5 Any player directly entering the system at the U-19 level without undergoing age verification at the U-16 level, and whose birth certificate is registered within two years after birth, will be restricted to a maximum of three year of participation in BCCI U-19 tournaments.

6.2.6 Any player directly entering the system at the U-19 level without undergoing age verification at the U-16 level, and whose birth certificate is registered more than two years after birth, will be restricted to a maximum of one year of participation in BCCI U-19 tournaments.

Note: The counting of a player's eligibility years begins once they are included in the Playing XI.

6.1 Age / Domicile Fraud Measures: Players submitting fake or tampered birth/ domicile certificates will face a two-year ban from all cricket matches under BCCI and State Units.

6.2 Voluntary Disclosure Scheme: Players who voluntarily admit to manipulating his/her date of birth will not be suspended and can continue playing in the appropriate age group if they disclose his/her actual date of birth before the deadline.

Part-II Policy for Affiliation of Cricket Tournaments

7. Policy Regulations for Affiliating Cricket Tournaments within CAU Jurisdiction

7.1 Objective

The purpose of establishing policy regulations for affiliating cricket tournaments within the jurisdiction of the Cricket Association of Uttarakhand (CAU) is to ensure fairness, transparency, and consistency in the administration of the sport. These regulations aim to standardize, regulate, promote, and uphold the quality of all cricket tournaments conducted under CAU's jurisdiction by granting official affiliation to eligible organizers.

Key Objectives:

- ✓ Regulation & Standardization – Define clear eligibility criteria and operational guidelines for tournament organizers.
- ✓ Integrity & Ethics – Prevent unethical practices such as match-fixing, age fraud, and doping.
- ✓ Promotion & Development – Support and encourage the growth of competitive and grassroots cricket.
- ✓ Fairness & Transparency – Ensure impartial decision-making in the affiliation process.





- ✓ Appointment of Match Officials – The CAU will be responsible for deputing match officials for the tournament. Priority will be given to local CAU qualified officials to promote their expertise to enhance their skills and support their professional career growth.
- ✓ Quality Assurance – Maintain high standards in tournament organization, infrastructure, and player welfare.
- ✓ Financial & Logistical Oversight – Ensure proper funding, sponsorship regulations, and venue management.
- ✓ Compliance & Governance – Align with national and state-level cricket regulatory frameworks.
- ✓ Player Welfare & Safety – Implement measures for player protection, medical assistance, and insurance coverage.
- ✓ Playing Conditions – Standard match conditions will apply, including field regulations, equipment specifications, and game duration.

7.2 Eligibility Criteria for Tournament Affiliation

- ✓ The organizing body must be a registered club, association, or institution of district body of CAU/BCCI.
- ✓ The organizer should have no pending disciplinary cases or sanctions with the District Authority CAU or BCCI.
- ✓ The tournament must conform to CAU-approved formats, age groups, and rules & regulations.
- ✓ Tournaments must be conducted within the territorial jurisdiction of the CAU.
- ✓ For open Category & Under-19 Category, any limited over tournament should be between 40-50 overs and for Under-14 & 16 Category, any limited over tournament should be between 35-50 overs

7.3 Special Criteria for All India level Tournaments

7.3.1 CAU Team Selection & Participation: If Team of CAU will participate in the tournament. Team selection will be managed by the CAU Management, in consultation





with the CAU Senior Men's Selection Committee.

7.3.2 Spin of Toss for Interrupted Matches: If a match is abandoned due to rain or other interruptions, and no viable result can be determined through standard playing conditions or by VJD, the outcome may be decided by a toss of the coin, as per the established rules and regulations.

7.3.3 Reserve Day for Finals: A reserve day will be allocated only for the final match to accommodate unforeseen weather interruptions or other circumstances affecting play.

7.3.4 Appointment of Officials from Nearby States: In case of unavailability of CAU-qualified officials or in exceptional circumstances, the CAU Authority may appoint officials from nearby states.

7.4 Application Process

To organize a tournament, the Club, Association, or Institution must submit a formal application to the relevant district or CAU authority at least 20 days before the tournament begins. The district authority will review the application and forward it, along with their comments, to the CAU Authority no later than 15 days before the tournament's commencement for final approval.

For State or All India-level tournaments), the organizing body may submit the application directly to the CAU Authority, ensuring it is received at least 20 days before the tournament begins.

Application must include:

- ✓ Detailed tournament proposal
- ✓ Tournament Name
- ✓ Age Category
- ✓ Fixture/schedule & Prize Money (if applicable)
- ✓ List of participating teams
- ✓ Venue details and safety arrangements
- ✓ Medical provisions
- ✓ Proof of registration of the organizing body





- ✓ Entry fee (if applicable)
- ✓ Tournament affiliation fees

7.5 Tournament Affiliation Fee

- ✓ An affiliation fee, as determined by the Cricket Association of Uttarakhand (CAU) Authority, must be paid at the time of application to the relevant district authority, as a MICR cheque or demand draft (DD), issued in favor of the "Cricket Association of Uttarakhand."

Level of Tournament	Affiliation Fees
Tournament within the Jurisdiction of a District of Uttarakhand (District Level Participation)	INR 5,000/-
Tournament within the Jurisdiction of State of Uttarakhand (State Level Participation)	INR 10,000/-
Tournament within the Jurisdiction of State of Uttarakhand (All India Level Participation)	INR 15,000/-

*Note : Subject to change as per amendments.

7.6 Responsibilities of the Organizers

- ✓ Adherence to CAU/BCCI playing conditions and code of conduct
- ✓ Use of State/BCCI Qualified Umpires and scorers approved by the CAU
- ✓ Timely submission of match reports and statistics to the District Authority/ CAU.
- ✓ Ensure anti-corruption, anti-doping, and other ethical standards
- ✓ Provision of basic player welfare facilities (water, medical support, etc.)
- ✓ For State Level and All India Level participation tournaments, organizer shall not use either Logo or name of CAU or any District Association. Organizers may use the phrase "Tournament approved by Cricket Association of Uttarakhand" only on promotional materials.

7.7 Rights of the Cricket Association of Uttarakhand (CAU)

- ✓ Grant or reject permission for the tournament.





- ✓ Inspect venues and facilities to ensure compliance with standards.
- ✓ Assign CAU Qualified Officials as per requirement of the tournament.
- ✓ Suspend or withdraw affiliation in cases of non-compliance with regulations.
- ✓ Mandate branding and publicity of CAU in accordance with official guidelines.
- ✓ The CAU holds the authority to appoint a Tournament Observer for any tournament within its jurisdiction. The honorarium fees for the observer will be borne by the Tournament Organizer, following CAU norms. This appointment ensures proper oversight, adherence to regulations, and seamless execution of events under CAU governance.

7.8 Approval & Recognition

Upon verification of district/ state authority, the CAU will issue a formal Affiliation Certificate/ approval mail, allowing the tournament to be listed on the official calendar and eligible for support/logistics.

7.9 Disciplinary Actions

Any breach of this policy may lead to:

- ✓ Suspension of the tournament
- ✓ Disqualification of teams/players
- ✓ Blacklisting of the organizers

7.10 Appeal Process for Tournament Approval

If the concerned district authority refuses to accept the organizer's request letter, fails to forward the approval letter, or does not take any action on the request for tournament permission, the organizer may file an appeal with the CAU Authority or Affiliation Committee. The appeal must be submitted no later than 15 days before the tournament begins in the event of an adverse decision or if the request is placed on hold by the district authority.

7.11 Review & Amendments

This policy is subject to annual review and amendment by





the CAU Affiliation Committee/ Apex Council in alignment with BCCI guidelines.

8. Rules for Affiliation of T-20 Tournament by a State Association

In special condition to promote the competitive cricket, If permission is granted by CAU Authority to organize a T-20 tournament, the organizer must comply with the criteria established by the CAU:

8.1 Application & Approval Process

- ✓ The tournament organizer must submit an affiliation request to the state association at least 30 days prior to the tournament start date.
- ✓ The request must include tournament format, rules, venues, participating teams, and financial details.
- ✓ Approval shall be granted by Secretary, CAU only upon verification of the organizer's credibility and compliance with CAU policies.

8.2 Affiliation Fee & Financial Compliance

- ✓ The organizer must pay an affiliation fee, of INR 25,000/- as a MICR cheque or demand draft (DD), issued in favor of the "Cricket Association of Uttarakhand".
- ✓ Financial transparency is mandatory, with organizers required to provide records of sponsorship, prize distribution, and expenses.

***Note:** Subject to change as per amendments.

8.3 Use of State Association Name & Branding

- ✓ The tournament must not use either Logo or name of CAU or any District Association.
- ✓ Organizers may only use the phrase "Tournament Approved by Cricket Association of Uttarakhand" only on promotional materials.

8.4 Team Eligibility & Player Registration

- ✓ Only Players registered with any private club, institution, academy of district of CAU Jurisdiction may participate.





- ✓ Players must meet the eligibility criteria set by the CAU, and prior approval must be obtained for outstation players.

8.5 Match Officials & Conduct Regulations

- ✓ All match officials (umpires, referees, scorers & Anti-Corruption) must be appointed by the CAU and their Fees/ Remuneration will be paid by the Organizers as per CAU norms.
- ✓ Tournament must follow the Code of Conduct established by the CAU/BCCI to ensure fair play and sportsmanship.
- ✓ Appointing an Anti-Corruption Officer is mandatory.

8.6 Player's Auctions & Point System Prohibited

- ✓ No player auctions are allowed in the tournament.
- ✓ The tournament must not implement a point-based system.

8.7 League Naming Guidelines

- ✓ The league name must not begin with "Uttarakhand" or include the term "Premier League" in any form.

8.8 Affiliation Rights

- ✓ The CAU Management holds exclusive rights to affiliate or disaffiliate (reject) any tournament.

8.9 Broadcasting & Betting Regulations

- ✓ Live telecasts need prior approval from CAU Management otherwise strictly prohibited.
- ✓ No association with betting applications is permitted,
- ✓ In the event of any breach, CAU Management reserves the right to disaffiliate the tournament at any time without prior notice to the organizers. Additionally, the organizers may be blacklisted by CAU for two years immediately and potentially for a lifetime by the apex body of CAU.

8.10 Report Submission & Compliance Check

- ✓ The organizer must submit a post-tournament report, including match results, financial statements, and





disciplinary actions, to the state association within 15 days of tournament completion.

Part-III Policy for Umpire/ Scorer & Coaching Staff

9. Policy for Umpire/ Scorer & Coaching Staff

9.1 Basic Eligibility Criteria:

- A. Must be an Indian citizen and should be part of CAU.
- B. Minimum Educational Qualification: 10+2 (Exemption applies to individuals who have cleared state/BCCI-level courses before September 2025).
- C. Age Limit: 18–60 years (Upper age limit applies to new umpires).
- D. Must successfully pass the Basic Level Exam of related field (conducted by the CAU) and/or BCCI Level 1/2 Certification.
- E. Previous cricketing background (first-class, club or district level) is preferred but not mandatory.
- F. The following minimum qualification requirements shall apply to Head Coaches in Board Tournaments:
 - ✓ Senior Teams (M/W): Coaches must hold a BCCI Level 2 certification, while Level 3 qualified coaches will be given preference.
 - ✓ Under-23 & Under-19 Age Group: Coaches must hold a BCCI Level 2 certification, while Level 3 qualified coaches will be given preference.
 - ✓ Under 16, Under-14 & Under-15 Girls Age Group: Coaches must possess a BCCI Level 1 certification at minimum, though Level 2 or Level 3 qualified coaches will be preferred.

Special Provisions for Former Players:

- ✓ Any ex-player is eligible to take up roles as an umpire, scorer, or coach, provided they have





completed a minimum of three years since their retirement.

9.2 Restrictions & Compliance

- ✓ CAU/BCCI Panel Umpires, Scorers, and Coaching Staff cannot participate as a player in any CAU/BCCI-affiliated match or tournament. Violating this rule may result in strict disciplinary action by CAU.
- ✓ BCCI/CAU State Panel Umpires & Scorers are authorized to officiate only at the district level and CAU-affiliated tournaments.
- ✓ Coaches and support staff intending to work with any franchise league must obtain prior approval from the CAU Authority if they are in a contracted period.
- ✓ All Coaches, Umpires, Scorers, and support staff who are contracted with the Cricket Association of Uttarakhand (CAU) or listed on the CAU panel are strictly prohibited from participating in unaffiliated or unauthorized tournaments. Any violation of this rule will lead to strict action by the CAU Management to uphold the integrity, professionalism, and governance of the association.

- ✓ The tournament organizers shall bear all the expenses for food and lodging of the Anti-Corruption Officer/ Umpires/ Scorer/ Video Analyst if required (including Remuneration and TA).

9.4 Match Allocation Process

- ✓ Officials are categorized into State Panel and BCCI Panel based on their qualifications and experience.
- ✓ Only panel-approved umpires and scorers are eligible for official matches





- ✓ Allocation is based on experience, performance, and availability.
- ✓ Senior umpires can be assigned high-profile matches, while junior officials handle district-level games.
- ✓ Rotation policy ensures equal opportunities for all officials.
- ✓ Only qualified and CAU-contracted coaches shall be given priority for assignments and training camps at the district level. This ensures that all coaching-related activities align with the Cricket Association of Uttarakhand (CAU) standards, maintaining quality, professionalism, and consistency across training programs.
- ✓ Officials cannot officiate matches involving teams they are associated with.
- ✓ Strict action is taken against violations of any rule.
- ✓ Assigned officials must confirm their availability before the match.
- ✓ In case of unavailability, replacements are arranged.
- ✓ Conflict of interest norms strictly followed.

9.5 Performance Review

- ✓ Post-match evaluations are conducted to assess decision-making accuracy and adherence to rules.
- ✓ Consistent performance leads to higher-level match allocations.
- ✓ Non-performers may face suspension or reassessment.

9.6 Code of Conduct

- ✓ Zero tolerance for corruption, match-fixing, or bias.
- ✓ Mandatory declaration of any conflict of interest.
- ✓ Officials cannot officiate matches involving teams they are associated with
- ✓ Adherence to BCCI Anti-Corruption Code.
